
to use at rallies.

Join Jodie Evans on Women's Spaces with Elaine B. Holtz Monday September 9th on radio station KBBF 89.1 at 11am & 11pm. Jodie will be talking about her recent book, *The Local Peace Economy*, which will cover local peace economy strategies. The Workbook and website are designed to help shift from a war economy to a more nurturing future. This interview will cover ways to connect with others committed to building resilient, caring local systems. She will also provide an update on what CODEPINK is involved with.

Jodie Evans is co-founder and board member of CODEPINK, and has been a peace, environmental, women's rights, and social justice activist for fifty years. She advocates for peaceful conflict resolution and promotes local peace economies by encouraging divestment from war. Evans is also co-founder and board chair of 826LA and serves on boards including Rainforest Action Network and the Institute of Policy Studies. A Lifetime Director at the Hereditary Disease Foundation, Evans is a mother, grandmother, and regenerative farmer. She co-edited "Twilight of Empire" and "Stop the Next War Now" and her latest publication is *The Local Peace Economy*.

Shout out to KBBF's radio host Ana Salgado, the host of the show Compartiendo y Aprendiendo (Sharing and Learning) every Friday from 4 to 6 p.m.

Last month, Ana joined a group of people who traveled to Washington to have proceedings with different representatives asking for support and commitment "...for immigration relief for more than 8 million people who would leave the shadows if an update were made to the registration law HR1511 and S2606." 
